I'm not yet 100% back, but I am so much better! I have been able to travel and to begin reading again. I would still be grateful for more prayer as I still tire quickly and have the occasional strong headache.


We've had a lot going on over the last few months, including:

- The 'El Redentor' church plant our team is serving in received its first members on Easter Sunday and then even more members in July. Pray that the Lord would continue to bless this work!
- Our older two graduated from The University of Alabama in Huntsville! They are both now employed and starting to learn to about post-school life. We're so grateful we were able to make it to the ceremony and had time to celebrate together.
- In May I was able to visit with our missionaries in Honduras - in both La Ceiba and Tegucigalpa. We're seeing some exciting kingdom advances there as we are consolidating our works there into a single team in Tegucigalpa.
- I continue to have opportunities to preach in various congregations here and also at Zion Presbyterian in Columbia, TN, when we traveled for the graduations.
- In June I was able to travel to the PCA General Assembly (annual gathering of pastors and elders) and to connect with many of our friends and partners there.
- Johnny was able to visit us for a week - despite several airline headaches. It was great to have time with him. He's now back to delivering pizzas until his junior year starts a few weeks from now.
- Last week Amy was in Colorado for her first and last on-campus intensive for her counseling degree. The intensives were virtual the last two years, so this was her first chance to meet her classmates in person. It was a huge blessing and encouragement to her.
- Next week Amy will take part in leading Parakaleo training in Cartagena, Colombia. There is a great group of women preparing to come together there. Pray that the Lord would bless this gathering!
- With most travel restrictions gone, I hope to visit with more of our missionaries through the fall. Please pray for provision and encouragement.


We ran into this guy on a hike.

Prayer Needs:

We need more missionaries! I feel like we're standing in the middle of a contradiction. On the one hand, there seem to be more open doors for gospel advancement right now than ever before. On the other, we don't have the people necessary to take on the work. Jesus said that the fields are white for the harvest - and that's exactly what we're seeing! Please pray to the Lord of the harvest to raise up more workers.

Continuing to get to know Medellín: We continue to get to know the city and the people as we slowly come out of the pandemic. Pray for friends and for opportunities to share the gospel!

Colombia's government and economy: In June, Colombia elected its first-ever leftist president. He has promised significant change. I'm not wise enough to know which policies will truly be best for the people, but for now it looks like Colombia is headed towards a lot of hardship. The peso has fallen over 20% compared to the dollar. So many people with means have left the country that everyone from doctors to hairdressers has noticed a decline in clients. Pray that the circumstances, whether prosperity or hardship, would serve for the advancement of Christ's kingdom.
