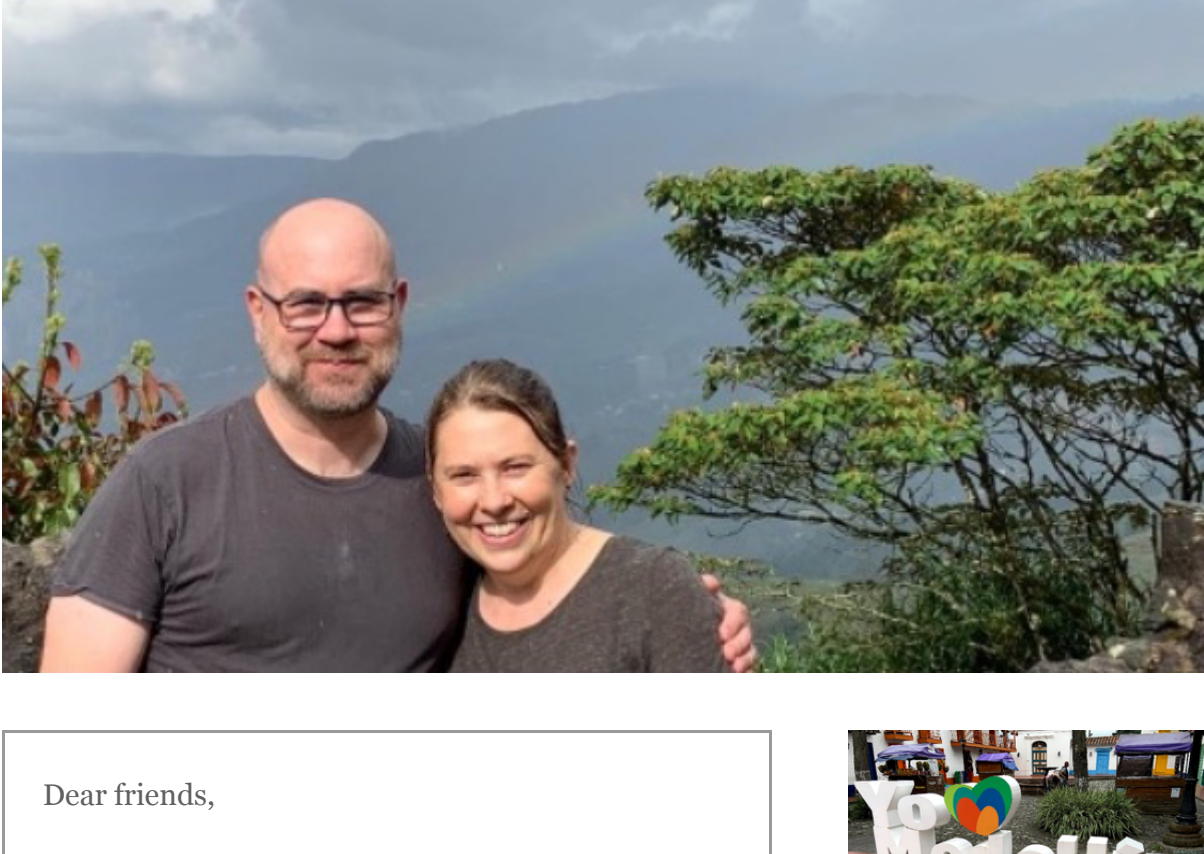


Happy Easter! He is risen, and he continues to build his Kingdom!

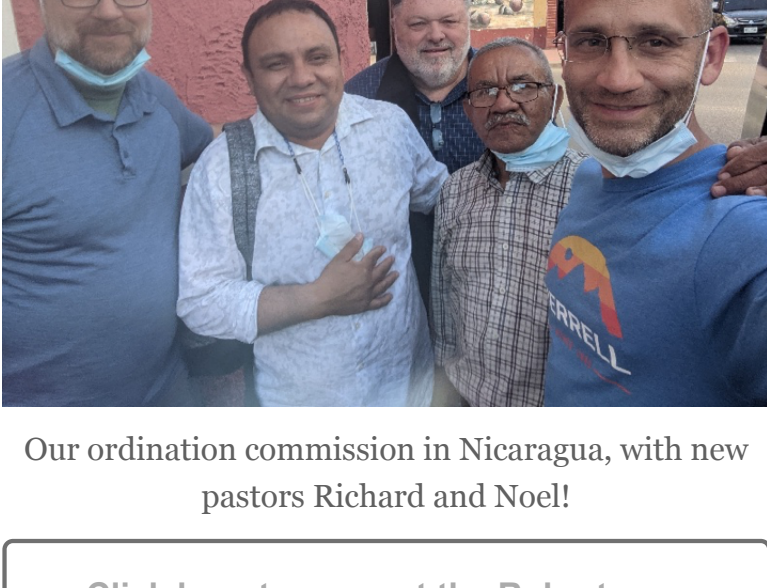
A few of our activities from the past months:

- Amy started the year off with Covid. Gratefully, it was a relatively mild case, and she didn't have to suffer my cooking for too long.
- In February, I got to be part of the ordination service for the first two Presbyterian pastors in the history of Nicaragua!
- In March, we got to participate in a missions conference at First Presbyterian Church in Augusta, GA, the church where Amy grew up. It was wonderful to connect with old friends, family, and new contacts. I even got to meet and befriend one of my favorite authors, Christopher Wright – who has been blessing me through his writing for the last 20 years.
- I've had the opportunity to preach in three churches here in Colombia. I also preached at an event in Nicaragua.
- I continue in various mentoring relationships with Latin American pastors and church planters.
- This week Amy is finishing her spring semester in her counseling program. She has a few summer courses and then should wrap up her degree in December!
- Amy has been able to get additional training in counseling techniques and is serving in MTW's counseling network.
- Amy's work with Parakaleo continues to flourish. They just had a 'básico' training in which 7 new women led the training for the first time - representing Mexico, Colombia, Puerto Rico, and Bolivia! The Lord keeps expanding the ability for them to minister to pastors' and church planters' wives.
- I also had a bittersweet reunion with so many members of our old MTW Mexico team at Jay Kyle's funeral. Jay, among many more notable things, was the one who originally recruited us to Guadalajara and who has been an encourager and mentor to us. We're so thankful for his life and ministry.

Que Dios los bendiga abundantemente.

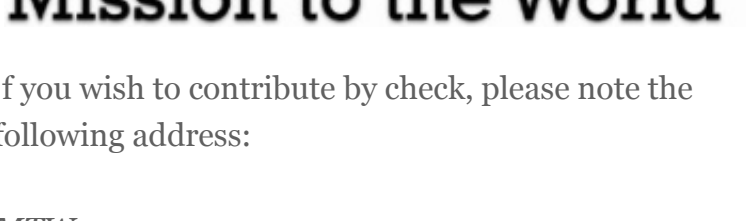

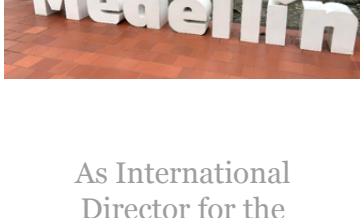

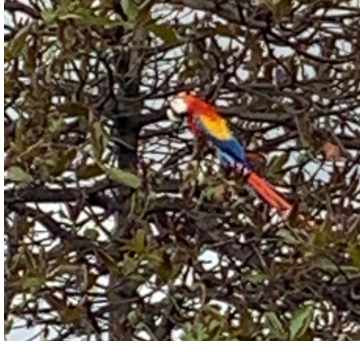
